



Hackathon rules

- **Registration and Eligibility**

Mandatory Registration: All participants must register before the event.

Eligibility Criteria: Define the eligibility criteria (age, skills, etc.).

- **Code of Conduct**

Respect and Inclusivity: All participants must respect others and promote an inclusive environment.

Non-Harassment: No form of harassment or discrimination will be tolerated.

- **Participation Rules**

Teams: Define the maximum and minimum team sizes.

Pre-work: Specify if pre-work is allowed or not.

Use of Technologies: Indicate if certain technologies or tools are mandatory or prohibited.

- **Judging Criteria**

Selection Criteria: Define the criteria on which projects will be evaluated (innovation, feasibility, social impact, etc.).

Jury: Introduce the jury and explain the judging process.

- **Schedule and Timeline**

Timeline: Provide a detailed schedule with start and end times, breaks, presentation sessions, etc.

Deadlines: Define the deadlines for project submissions.

- **Resources and Support**

Mentors: Indicate the availability of mentors and their role.

Resources: Provide information on available resources (hardware, software, documentation, etc.).

- **Intellectual Property**

Ownership Rights: Clarify the intellectual property rights of the projects developed during the hackathon.

Confidentiality: Ensure the confidentiality of participants' ideas and projects.

- **Safety and Health**

Safety Guidelines: Provide safety guidelines for the event.

Health: Encourage participants to take breaks and maintain good health practices during the event.

- **Rewards and Prizes**

Rewards: Detail the prizes and rewards offered to the winners.

Distribution: Explain how and when the prizes will be distributed.

- **Feedback and Improvement**

Feedback: Encourage participants to provide feedback after the event.

Improvement: Use the feedback to improve future hackathons.
